ROSS BEATY FORSTJÓRI MAGMA ENERGY CORPORATION

HÓTAR MÁLSÓKN VEGNA VIÐTALS VIÐ BJÖRK Í KANADÍSKU BLAÐI

18. nóvember

Í viðtali kanadíska tímaritsins MACLEANS (www2.macleans.ca) við Björk Guðmundsdóttur kom fram, að Björk teldi að fyrirtæki í eigu Ross Beaty hefðu orð á sér fyrir að brjóta lög um mannréttindi og samninga verkalýðsfélaga í Suður-Ameríku.

Eftir að viðtalið birtist á vef Macleans hafði Ross Beaty samband við blaðið og krafðist leiðréttingar á þessari staðhæfingu Bjarkar, ella myndi hann draga blaðið fyrir dómstóla vegna meiðyrða.

Blaðamaður Macleans, Tom Henheffer, sem tók viðtalið við Björk, valdi þann kost að birta "leiðréttingu" á vefsíðu blaðsins þann 12. nóvember þar sem segir:

"Pann 9. nóvember var birt viðtal við Björk á vefsíðunni þar sem hún heldur því fram að Ross Beaty og Magma Energy Corp. hafi brotið lög í Suður-Ameríku. Þetta er ekki rétt og við biðjum Ross Beaty og fyrirtæki hans afsökunar".

Hið rétta er að í viðtalinu sagði Björk:

"Companies owned by Ross Beaty have a bad reputation for breaking serious humanitarian and union laws in South America"

Björk nefnir ekki Magma Energy Corporation í þessu samhengi, enda er það fyrirtæki Ross Beaty, Pan American Silver, sem hún vísar til.

Prátt fyrir að Macleans fékk sendar fjölda ábendinga um greinar þar sem fjallað er um slæmt orðspor Pan American Silver í Suður-Ameríku valdi blaðið að breyta viðtalinu og biðja Ross Beaty afsökunar.

Petta er enn eitt dæmið um hvernig stórfyrirtæki beita valdi sínu til að hafa áhrif á umræðuna og hóta lögsókn til að að þagga niður opinbera umræðu. Mörg dæmi um slík mál eru rakin á heimasíðu Icelandic Modern Media Initiative (immi.is).

Staðreyndin er sú, að starfsemi Pan American Silver og annarra kanadískra námafyrirtækja í Suður Ameríku hefur verið gagnrýnd víðar og staðhæfing Bjarkar er ekki úr lausu lofti gripin, heldur byggir hún á opinberum heimildum um Pan American Silver og starfsemi fyrirtækisins í Suður Ameríku.

Hótanir Ross Beaty um málssókn breytir þar engu um. Þar sem bæði upprunalega viðtalið við Björk, sem og "leiðrétting" Macleans hafa verið fjarlægð af vef

Ross is the founder and chairman of PAN AMERICAN SILVER CORPORATION, which operates metal mines in Bolivia, Mexico and Peru, where mining is done by the book: environmental disasters, human rights violations, low paid labour and union restrictions, to mention but a few of the industry standards."

"For example, a recent study of a Canadian subsidiary, PAN AMERICAN SILVER, operating in the department through a shared-risk contract with the state company COMIBOL (COMIBOL effectively controls about 30% of the project), shows that the company will pay merely 17% taxes and royalties on projected gross sales value over the next 30 years. The taxes going to the municipality where the company is located, one of the poorest in the country, are just over 0.5%. This is straightforward looting. By comparison, in various shared risk contracts in Chile (hardly a socialist haven) taxes and royalties going to all levels of the state amount to up to 51%, whereas, in Peru, it's on the order of 26%."


